We serve a student population unique among higher education institutions in the state that includes first generation students, returning and adult students, international and immigrant students, and student parents.

Students gain real-world experience in nonprofit governance, public policy, and organizing that help them make a difference on their campus and in their communities.

Support the Full Minnesota State Budget Request

Focus: Access & Afforability

- State appropriations cover a significant portion of colleges' general fund operating budgets, which keep tuition affordable and academic programs intact.
- Workforce Focused Supports continue the work of enhancing state-of-the-art equipment and learning environments for high-cost, high-need workforce programs.
- Financial barriers to higher education stretch beyond tuition costs. The cost of required materials and tools put an additional burden on students, **providing free open educational resources are vital** to providing accessible, affordable and attainable higher education.
- Emergency Grant Assistance helps students regain financial stability and support college attainment. 30% of respondents from MN two-year colleges were both food and housing insecure, 20% could not pay the full amount of their utilities costs.

Focus: Basic Needs

- Nearly 40% of Minnesota's undergraduate students experience basic needs insecurity. **Investment in basic needs, student supports,** and free open educational resources are vital to providing accessible, affordable and attainable higher education.
- Mental health is becoming a growing crisis among college students impacting academic and co-curricular success. Services like Mantra Health offer support to students at no cost.

Hunger Free Campus

Focus: Improvements to Hunger Free Campus Grant Access

- Of the 26 Minnesota State colleges, less than half (11) have a Hunger Free Designation while over 40% of Minnesota State students experience food insecurity
- Students who experience hunger and food insecurity are significantly less likely to graduate than their peers. We support improvements to the Hunger Free Campus Grants program that **remove barriers of access for our campuses** so that the full resources of the grants are utilized to get food into the hands of students who need it.



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
