Position Description

Part-time, maximum \$5,400 stipend position

Paid at \$20.00/hour, roughly 20 hours per month from July to June

Responsibilities of the Leadership Council

The Leadership Council is responsible to turn the vision and goals of the LeadMN Board of Directors into reality by working hand-in-hand with staff. The Leadership Council is made up of the President, Vice President, Treasurer, and Secretary. While each member of the Leadership Council is an elected spokesperson for LeadMN, they do not have independent decision making authority unless delegated directly by the Board of Directors. They do not supervise staff and they do not set policy or the budget, as these are the roles of the Board of Directors. Each member of the Leadership Council will:

- Attend all LeadMN Board of Directors meetings;
- Attend and/or Chair LeadMN committee meetings as outlined within the responsibilities of each role;
- Attend any additional committee meetings within their areas of interest;
- Take their direction from the Board, as outlined in the annual policy development process and the annual budgeting process;
- Work hand-in-hand with staff to turn the vision and goals of LeadMN into reality; and
- Provide a report each month on the work they perform on behalf of LeadMN.

Responsibilities of the Vice President

As Vice President, you will lead and represent the Leadership Council, with responsibilities that include:

- Primary Leadership Council member to assist in planning, coordinating, and implementing LeadMN D.C. Summit, LeadMN Advocacy Day, and other actions at the State Capitol;
- Assist the President as needed in coordinating policy. This can include assisting in research, drafting the annual LeadMN legislative agenda, working on external partnership building, and providing legislative updates to the Board of Directors;
- Assist with coordination, organization, and updates of the Star Campus Program;
- Meet monthly, during the academic year, with the Chancellor of Minnesota State according to the Chancellor's availability;
- Meet bi-weekly with the Leadership Team made up of the Leadership Council and LeadMN staff members;
- Meet quarterly with the leadership at Students United;

- In rotation with the additional Leaders, provide testimony to the Board of Trustees at their regularly scheduled meetings,
- Chair the Advocacy Committee in the absence of the President; and
- Shall strive to advocate in the best interest and welfare of the association members.

Skills and Benefits You Will Gain

- Earn compensation for your role;
- Develop professional accountability and leadership skills;
- Master stakeholder engagement and elevate diverse voices in organizational decision-making;
- Receive training as a spokesperson and gain experience representing an organization publicly;
- And expand your professional network.

Training You Will Receive

The Leadership Council shall take part in a mandatory training session (Incoming Leaders Training in late August) covering the roles, responsibilities, and expectations for each member. This training is required for all members before assuming their position.

Continued training will be provided at Leadership Team meetings and individual one-to-one meetings with staff.
